The Torch is on the Move

The significance of the Olympic Torch goes back in history to the ancient Olympic Games in Olympia, Greece. According to the old myth, a flame was ignited by the sun and kept burning until the closing of the Olympic Games. However, the Special Olympics Torch Run involves something a bit more special, the Law Enforcement of the host city runs the torch. The mission



of the Law Enforcement Torch Run® (LETR) for Special Olympics is to increase awareness and raise funds for the Special Olympics movement. Each year, the LETR initiative grows bigger and better. This year the Los Angeles Police Department had the honor of being the LETR for the Special Olympics World Games and by special invitation Valley Village participated in two of the Torch Run ceremonies.

Essentially, the LETR is an actual running event, in which officers and athletes run the Flame of Hope[™] (the torch) to the Opening Ceremony of local Special Olympics competitions as well as State, National and World Games. The Flame of Hope was lit from the rays of the sun in Greece, the home of the Olympics, and this year it traveled across the sea to the United States where it journeyed to communities throughout the country and Southern California, ended at the Opening Ceremony in the historic Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum.
