**Our Day Programs Provide Unique Learning Experiences** 

Imagine discovering a heart dysrhythmia on your first day of on-site training as a student nurse! That's what two of our volunteers from Critical Care Institute found while assessing a client in May. Shiloh Decker and Kellee Clodt made the new finding on their first day here as Level 1 nursing students, explained their CCI instructor, Diana Just, LVN. The finding was confirmed and reported to a Valley Village nursing supervisor, and the client was referred for cardiac evaluation.

Shiloh and Kellee were recognized by the school and received Lamplighter pins from the Dean, an honor usually reserved for later in the instruction cycle. A dysrhythmia, the instructor explained, is when the heart skips a beat. We appreciate that the student nurses at our day programs are so competent and caring.

Nursing students learn and practice many skills in their rotations at our Adult Day Health Care and Adult Day Programs in Winnetka and Sunland. But just as important, they develop an understanding of our special population, and they learn to communicate with clients who may not even speak. They also share the fun, learning how important music, art and recreation therapies are for our clients to live their lives to the fullest.

Our outings program to promote community integration is part of that fun. The nursing students join clients and staff on our buses to visit attractions, parks, museums and other recreational venues. They help with wheelchairs and other client needs so the group can get out and enjoy the bigger world. The clients love to get out, and they also love to spend time with the volunteer student nurses.
