Here are some ways you supported Valley Village in 2022.

VOLUNTEERISM: Volunteer participation is vital to Valley Village's enrichment activities for clients! This year, we resumed in-person volunteer activities for the first time since early 2020! We held our first Super Saturday since the start of the pandemic at Elks Lodge 2190 Canoga Park, where the Elks sponsored an ice cream social for our clients. Super Saturday is a community-based recreation event for clients in our residential program. Volunteers served pizza and ice cream, played bingo, and danced with our clients. We are grateful to reconnect and engage with the community through enriching and fun activities like Super Saturdays that support our clients' social and daily living skill development and maintenance.

Volunteers also helped us revitalize the gardens at our three, day programs. They got involved in various ways: in the planning stages, which included helping us shop for supplies, plants, and seedlings, assisting in the prep work, and the actual planting! Volunteers got to know clients, assisted them in choosing their plants, and helped cultivate beautiful, raised beds filled with flowers and different kinds of vegetables – many of which are thriving and starting to yield their first produce! It was a hands-on learning activity that was so popular with our clients and volunteers that we will be offering an opportunity soon to help reinvigorate our community garden at Balboa Park.

Volunteers also were deeply involved in helping to plan our 50th Anniversary event, Solid Gold 70s. The planning committee was instrumental in the success of the fundraiser. We met virtually once a month, and our volunteers led sub-committees, brainstormed themes, researched vendors, assisted in coordinating silent auction items, and helped secure sponsors.
